
Life at Weldricks Pharmacy



Web Developer

I have been a Web Developer at Weldricks for over 10 years. Over that time, we have built a bespoke website from the ground up, from server and database design to user interface and user experience features, whilst catering for the unique challenges supplying medicines remotely.

Website lifetimes are finite and we are constantly looking to develop and improve our next generation site, building upon the lessons learnt from our current one. New integrations, new features, improved accessibility, and improved capacity are all being worked on in partnership with the internal and external users of the systems, alongside my marketing and operations colleagues.

Prescription Delivery Driver

I started as a Warehouse Operative mainly picking and packing stock for the branches but quickly moved on to become a Retail Delivery Driver, delivering the much-needed medication out to branches daily, making sure our customers get what they want at the right time.

At Weldricks, it is all about progression and learning new skills. My line manager saw early potential in me, so I was then asked to become a key holder for the warehouse, which holds a huge responsibility due to the amount of stock holding we carry, along with helping me learn new people skills as I progressed through my early management career in distribution. Along the way I was encouraged to participate in various work-related courses to help with my development.

I have now taken on another role as a Prescription Delivery Driver. This role is to ensure patients get their medication on time. My customers consist of elderly, infirm and housebound people who usually can't drive or use public transport. An important part of the job is one-on-one interaction, so taking time out of my daily tasks to interact with customers is a massive part of my current role.

Head of Operations

I started out at Weldricks as a Pharmacy Assistant back in 1993 and I moved to another branch where I took on the Supervisor role.

In 1995, I started a dispensing technician's course. This was done in partnership with Sunderland University. The course was challenging, but a real achievement for me, at which point I carried out a dual role in branch as Supervisor/Dispensing Tech.

I have always had a passion for the retail aspect of pharmacy and love helping customers daily. In 2000, a position came up at our Branch Service Centre to work alongside the Director of Operations, a role I was lucky enough to secure.

I have now been in this role for over 22 years, however, the role and the title that come with it has evolved. I completed a Business Diploma with Cambridge University back in 2007, and more recently an MBA in 2013, and I now hold the position of Head of Operations.
